

## PASSOVER I: RANSOMED TO SERVICE

### INTRODUCTION

### BIBLICAL LESSON

The Passover season is a time to reflect on the work of deliverance in our lives. God has redeemed us from sin. In this season we also remember that sin should be put out of our lives. Today's lesson focuses on the redemption the Jesus worked out for us on the cross, and that our duty is to remove sin daily from our lives.
